



# 2020 Monsoon Flood Recovery Project

Humanitarian response to restore safety, dignity and resilience of flood-affected people in

# BANGLADESH





From September 2020 to March 2021, BRAC rehabilitated the communities affected by the one of the most prolonged floods in recent history.

During this recovery project, we restored the safety, dignity and resilience of the flood-affected people living in six vulnerable upazilas of Jamalpur, Lalmonirhat and Sirajganj.

UK's Foreign, Commonwealth Development Office (FCDO) through the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS) partnered with us through these efforts.

The project reached a total of 12,500 households that are severely affected by the flood. The most marginalised people were benefitted by food security and livelihood support, flood resilient shelter support and improved access to safe water and proper sanitation.

The project's success lies in several factors. Firstly, BRAC prioritised on consulting the people of the community; listened to their concerns, identified their needs and considered their opinions in shaping the project components. Next, the local government and their guidance were valued in every step of the way. At upazila and union level, the government representatives participated in selecting beneficiaries who needed our support the most. Lastly, the formation of project implementation committees established leadership within the communities who took ownership in ensuring the best outcome for the project that is beneficial to the people.
