

Dhaka is the capital city of Bangladesh. It is located on the banks of the Buriganga river. BRAC has its headquarters in Dhaka, where it is running most of its core programmes. Among them, microfinance is the largest, offering two types of loans – dabi (microloan) and progoti (enterprise loans). BRAC's Education Programme (BEP) stands as the second largest in this district.

BEP runs about 2,500 schools, the adolescent development programme (ADP), and *gonokendros* (community libraries). The health, nutrition and population programme (HNPP) is another core programme running successfully in this district. It is a combination of preventive, curative, rehabilitative and promotional health services, focusing on improving maternal, neonatal and child health (IMNCS), as well as combating communicable diseases and common health problems, forming the key component of essential healthcare. TUP focuses on tackling extreme poverty in multiple fronts. HRLS serves the disadvantaged community through its human rights and legal education (HRLE) shebikas. GJD works relentlessly to eliminate gender injustice in society. Migration works on ensuring easy access to services of all Bangladeshi migrants to avoid exploitation. BRAC's new initiative, the skills development programme, provides holistic skills development

Apart from these, BRAC runs urban street children programme (USCP) to create a provision for safe childhood for the most underprivileged children who are born/grow up on the streets and inspire these children to aim for an empowered future.
