

Manikgani is a district located in central Bangladesh. It is a part of the Dhaka division, with an area of 1,379 square kilometres. It is one of the nearest districts to Dhaka. only 70 kilometres away from the city. It bound by the Tangail district in the north, Dhaka district in the east, Faridpur district in the south, the Padma and Jamuna rivers and the districts of Pabna and Rajbari in the west. The main rivers are the Padma, Jamuna, Dhaleshwari, Ichamati and Kaliganga.

This city is surrounded by rivers. As a result few of the sub-districts are affected by river bank erosion every year. The people of Manikganj are mostly involved in agriculture. BRAC started its operation here in 1974. Right now, most of BRAC's core programmes, such as microfinance, education (BEP). health, nutrition and population (HNPP), targeting the ultra poor (TUP), community empowerment (CEP), skills development and human rights and legal aid services (HRLS). Apart from that, BRAC has also established a few of its social enterprises here, directly helping to create job opportunities for hundreds of women.

Baliati Zamindar Place, Fort at Fordnagar, tomb of Shah Rustam and Gauranga Math are some of the tourist attractions in the district.
