

Situated by the bank of the famous river Padma, Rajbari district lies under Dhaka division, and has an area of 1,118 square kilometres. The other main rivers in the area are the Kumar, Garai, Madhumoti and Chandana. It is bounded by Pabna district on the north, Faridpur and Magura districts on the south, Manikganj district on the east, Kushtia and Jhenaidah districts on the west.
