



# Integrated Development Programme (IDP)

## Introduction

Despite notable progress in poverty alleviation, 41.7 million people continue to live in extreme poverty in Bangladesh (BBS, 2023). Around 24.6% of the population are multidimensionally poor (MPI, 2024), reflecting that people remain underserved with basic services, especially amongst socially marginalised and geographically isolated communities.

BRAC's Integrated Development Programme (IDP) aims at building resilience of the communities constrained by geographical, social, and climate-induced barriers through deepening the delivery of critical services, and promoting livelihood opportunities and enhancing coping mechanisms.

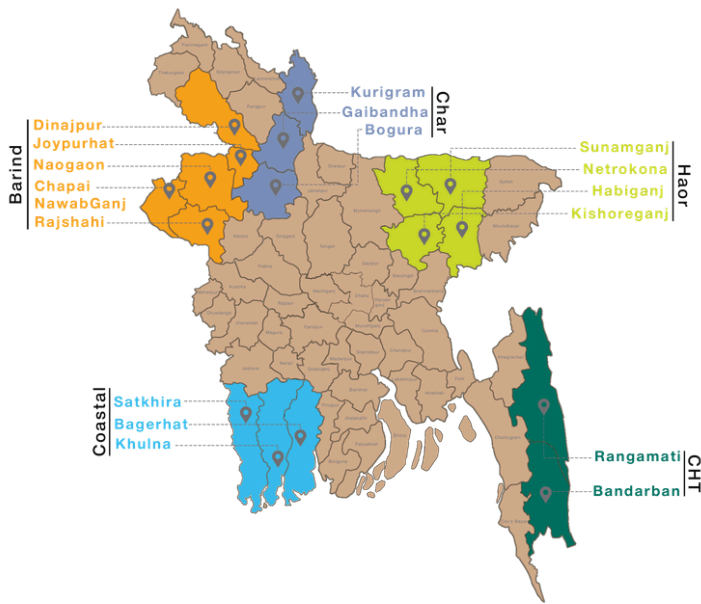
## What We Do

IDP is carrying BRAC's legacy of providing holistic development services through a community-centric approach. IDP's core approach entails establishment of women-led Village Development Organisations (VDOs), known as service delivery hub. It serves as platform for fostering community participation, women empowerment, and locally driven action while identifying and addressing the needs of

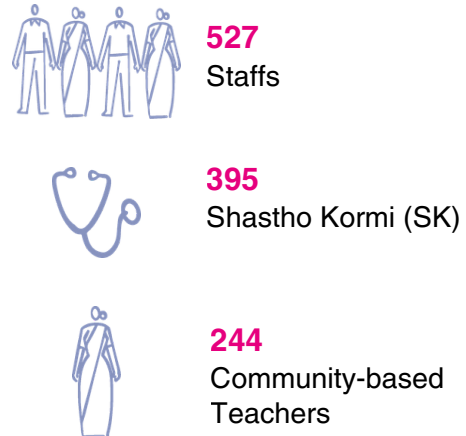


vulnerable households. In response, multiple services are designed and addressed to the various stages of life such as education, health, skills, awareness on legal rights, access to safe water and sanitation are delivered of those who in need. The services reach the targeted households to reduce service gap through four delivery channels: direct interventions, synergies with BRAC wide services, linkage with government schemes, and private sector engagement. It functions in line with Sustainable Development Goals 1,2,3,4,5,6,8 and 10.
