Programme/Enterprise Description

As a major actor in Bangladesh's development landscape, BRAC is working to Promote safe, regular and responsible migration and combatting human trafficking and has both the credibility and nationwide network to establish itself as a reliable provider of reintegration services to returnee migrants.

Since 2006, Migration Programme has been promoting safe, regular and responsible migration by ensuring migrants know their rights and how to exercise them, facilitating sustainable reintegration, addressing and abating human trafficking and migration vulnerability of people, to achieve sustainable development goal 10.7, 8.7, 5.2 and 16.2.

Project/Unit Description

Each year, over 50,000 women and children are trafficked from Bangladesh into India for the purposes of sexual exploitation. Poor girls and women living in border communities are particularly vulnerable to networks of traffickers operating in hotspots like Jashore District. BRAC has designed an evidence-driven and scalable model that integrates activities to increase awareness, capacity and coordination between communities, government and non-state actors to create Partnerships, and improve mechanisms for the Prevention of Cross-border Trafficking (CBT), Protection of victims and the Prosecution of traffickers (the 4Ps). This project seeks to reduce the vulnerability of children and women to trafficking for commercial sexual exploitation from Jashore to India through capacity building, service integration, awareness raising and advocacy reaching 161,215 people (and a further 100,000+ people through a digital media campaign in Jashore) and support the repatriation and reintegration of 50 Bangladeshi child victims of sex trafficking in India.

Purpose of Internship(including learning outcomes)

This internship is designed to share an experience of developing transformational model to reduce the child and women trafficking, with a sense of ownership and responsibility. Intern will have the opportunity to challenge our assumptions about the people we serve, question our plans, and

gain new perspectives, together. We will push them to become a proactive lifelong learner, and encourage them to experiment and fail rightly, by gaining insights from their experiences.
