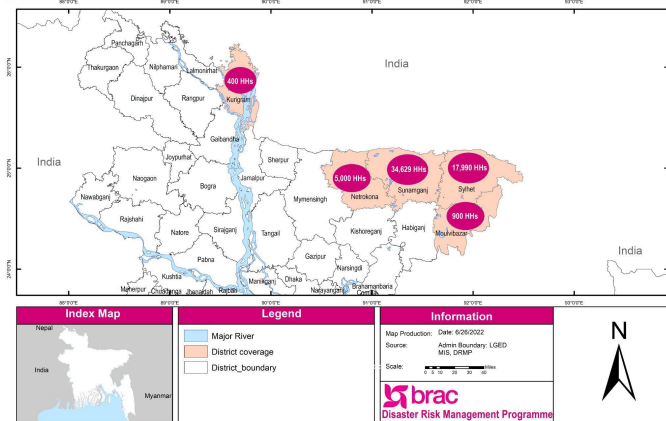

Disaster Risk Management Programme

SITUATION OVERVIEW

- The flash flood in the northeastern region left millions of people in **crises of food, drinking water, sanitation**
- Inadequate nutritious food for **under-five children, pregnant and lactating women**
- Significant erosion of **houses, damaged tube wells, latrines** and other community infrastructures
- Meeting basic needs is urgent. **Early recovery support** must be prioritised as crisis unfolds

families supported with livestock feed



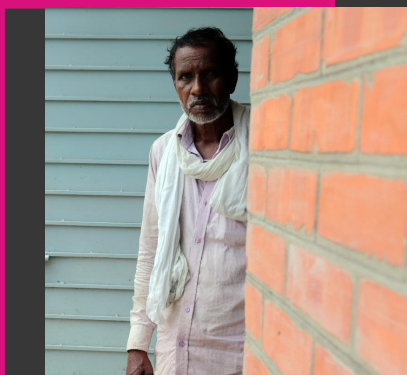
40,000

Flooding washed away livestock feed, leaving animals starving for days. Families are finally being able to feed their cows after feed distribution

Thunderstorm and heavy wind made it almost impossible to swim, but we had to push through. I couldn't find my mother anywhere. After three days, we found her corpse, floating in the water. ”
