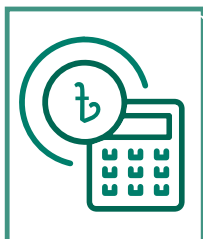

Outcome/ Objective

Outcome 1: Improved safeguards against COVID-19 among the target population of 17 selected slums of Sirajganj Municipality

Outcome 2: Restored income opportunities of the 4,205 target households whose occupations were affected due to COVID pandemic

Outcome 3: The target disadvantaged children are better protected from the risks of discontinuation of education as a consequence of COVID-19



Key problems identified by the project

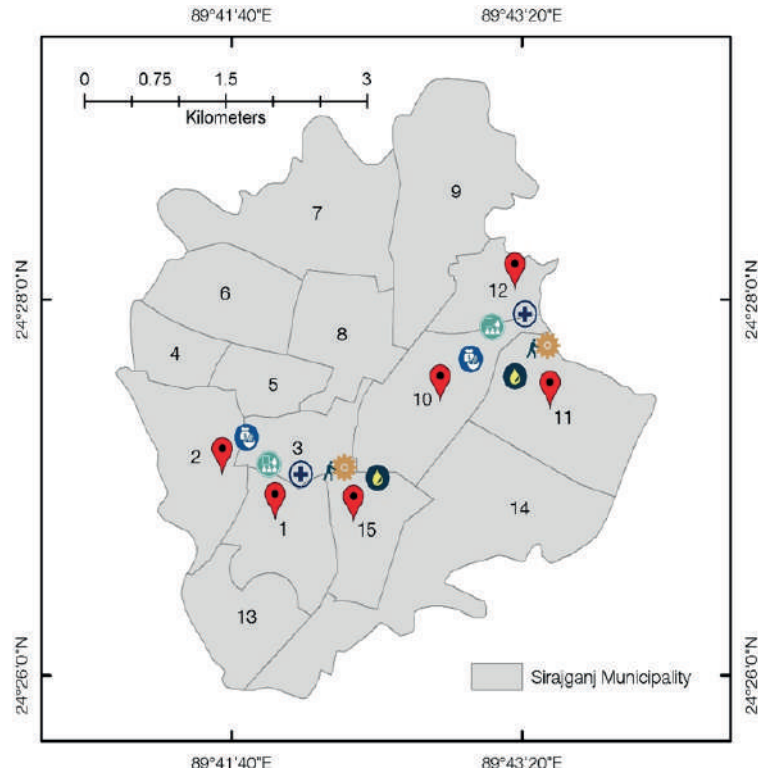
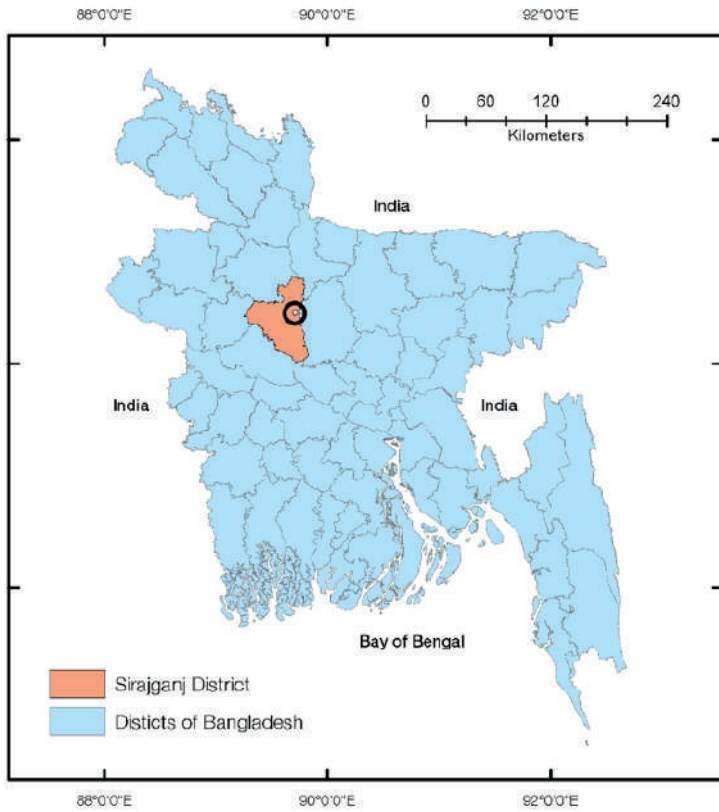
- ▶ The COVID-19 pandemic induced negative impacts on health and livelihood
- ▶ Fragile condition of the existing WASH and health facilities in the proposed slum areas
- ▶ Lack of access to health services, including COVID-19 vaccination
- ▶ Impacts of COVID-19 on livelihood of slum people
- ▶ Family income reduced due to increased unemployment rates during pandemic
- ▶ Increase in child labor due to parents inability to bear children's educational expenses
- ▶ Exposure to social unrest, violence against women, domestic violence, and early marriage



Highlights on proposed adaptation/ mitigation solutions

- ▶ Conducting 736 awareness sessions on socio-economic consequences of COVID-19, personal health, hygiene, income, nutrition, and education issues
- ▶ Installation of 4 hand washing stations, 12 tube-wells and 1 solar power water pump and rain water harvesting system
- ▶ Renovation of 4 hand washing stations, 2 water points and 43 tube-wells
- ▶ Increase access to health services including COVID vaccination
- ▶ Support to develop a COVID resilience livelihood recovery plan for 4,205 households
- ▶ Skill training with cash grant to initiate income generating activities for 1,705 beneficiaries
- ▶ Renovation of 8 classrooms of two primary schools, to support continuity of education

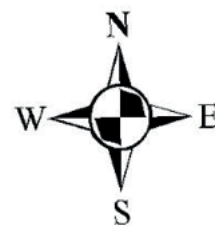
