## Outcome/ Objective

Improvement of COVID-19 resilience along with livelihood conditions of 30,000 extreme poor including climate migrants in 16 urban slums of Sirajganj Pourashava



### Key problems identified by the project

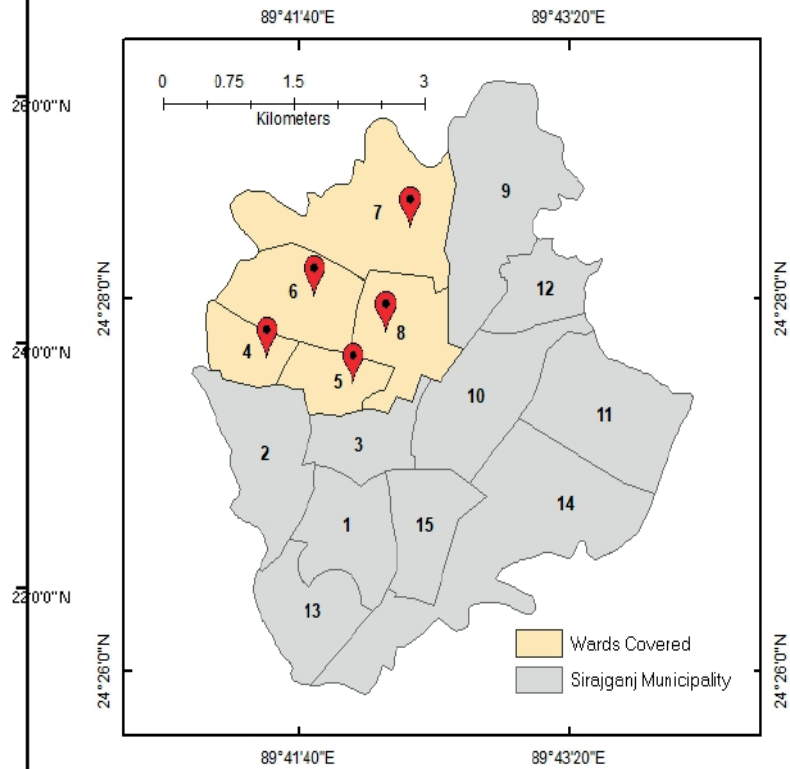
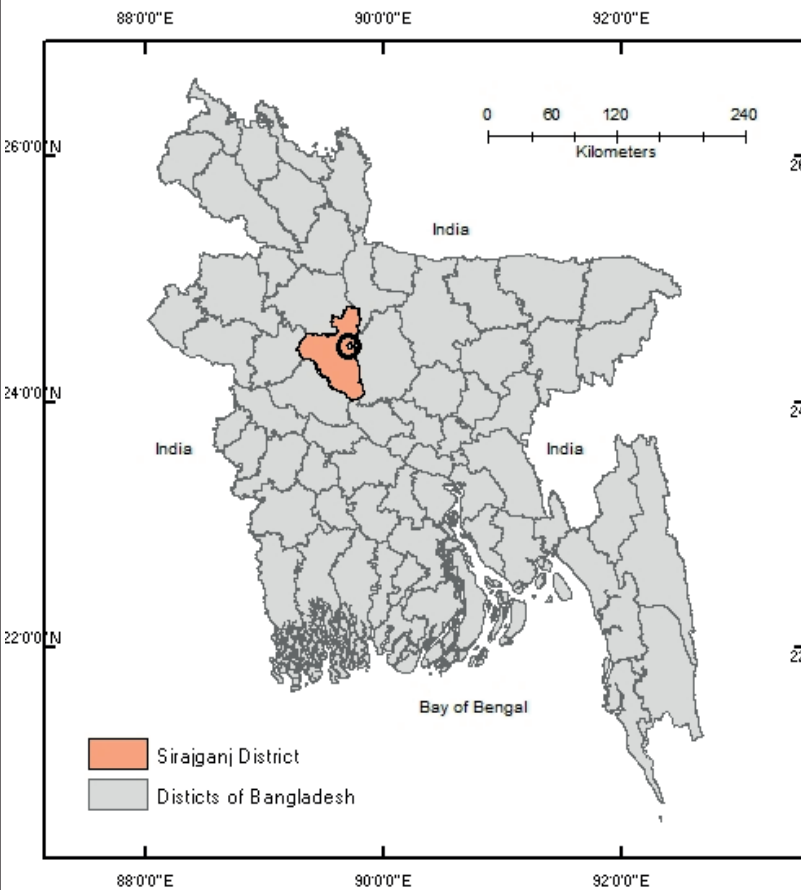
- ▶ Increased health risks due to COVID-19
- ▶ Riverbank erosion and flood affect Sirajganj city almost every year with increasing intensities
- ▶ Inability to repair houses damaged during flood due to poor financial condition
- ▶ Lack of basic services, i.e., water, sanitation, education, health and social
- ▶ Lack of sustainable livelihoods is the core problem for climate migrants
- ▶ Lack of awareness reduces access to services from Pourashava and Government
- ▶ Lower employment opportunity due to lack of skills among climate migrants



### Highlights on proposed adaptation/ mitigation solutions

- ▶ Distribution of COVID-19 hygiene materials among 5,000 households
- ▶ Delivering 170 hand washing devices in the community for awareness and to scale up better practices
- ▶ Installation of 9 hand washing stations in nine schools and one health centre
- ▶ Installation (33) and renovation (188) of tube wells at the community
- ▶ 268 existing unhygienic latrines will be converted into hygienic ones
- ▶ Installation of 23 single-pit latrines for extremely poor households
- ▶ Housing improvement support (plinth raising, pillar, roof, wall etc.) for 50 extremely poor and climate-vulnerable households
- ▶ Arranging skill development training for 100 youth to increase income
- ▶ Skill development training and cash transfer for 150 women for starting a business (rearing poultry, duck, cow, sewing etc.)
