Improved livelihood, increased income, and access to social safety net services for the new poor living in the climate vulnerable communities



Key problems identified by the project

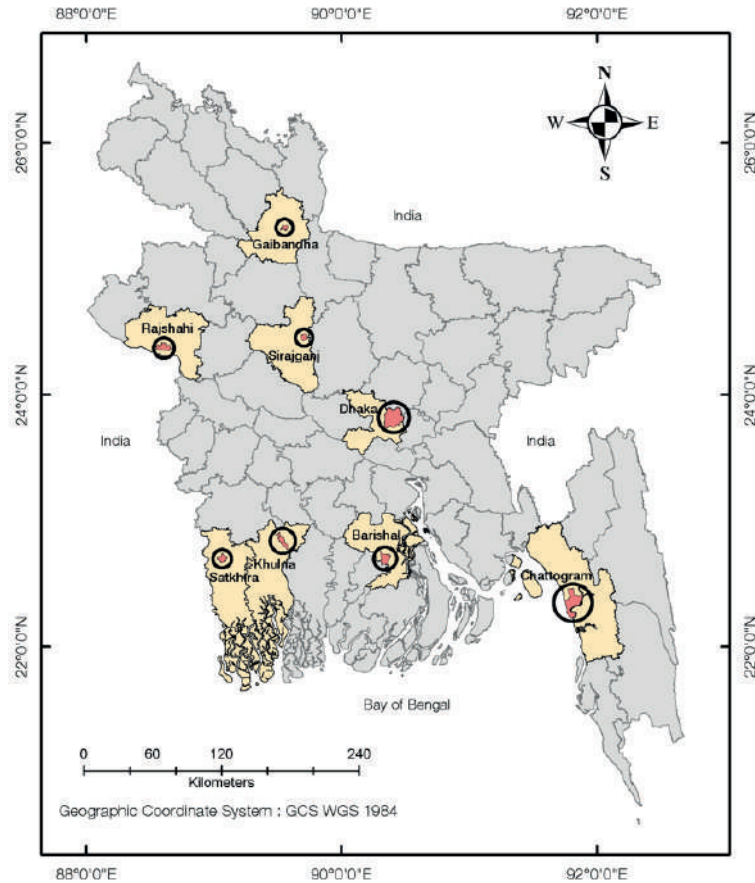
- ▶ Adverse impact on livelihood of climate migrants/slum dwellers due to COVID-19
- ▶ Climate migrants and poor households experiences loss of income, reduced savings, and reverse migration
- ▶ New poor emerged due to COVID-19, suffer from attaining a stable income source and food insecurity
- ▶ Lack of access to government social safety net programme in meeting nutritional needs of children
- ▶ Lack of sufficient Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) infrastructure
- ▶ The rural skill-based newcomers as unskilled city-inhabitants and are unable to switch to any alternative income generating options which leads social inequality
- ▶ Immediate emergency response mechanism and adequate measures are needed to address marginalized communities with essential assistance and support to improve livelihood



Highlights on proposed adaptation/ mitigation solutions

- ▶ Installation of 25 water points and 27 latrines cum water points in selected communities
- ▶ 3,750 participants will receive financial literacy, entrepreneurship development and business management (EDBM)
- ▶ Providing short-term assistance to 720 most vulnerable families in meeting nutritional needs of the children
- ▶ 500 youth will receive market-driven skills training and/ hands-on apprenticeship leading to decent jobs
- ▶ 5,000 participants will be getting livelihood/ business support
- ▶ Skill development of youth for job placement via market linkage and creating a skilled, experienced and better paid workforce
- ▶ Advocacy initiatives for city authority and concerned local government agencies to include climate-vulnerable and new poor households as participants

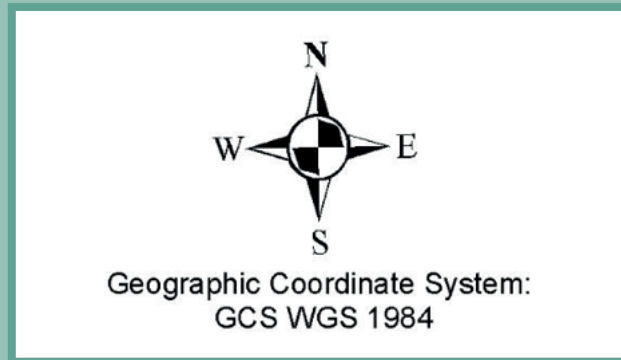
