Outcome-1: Increased income of the Climate-induced Migrant Households (CMHs) through livelihood practices that increase economic resilience (the ability to recover/ absorb from climatic hazard or shocks and having capacity to withstand).

Outcome-2: Improved lives of the targeted CMHs through awareness on CCA, WASH, health, drainage, waste management, housing, cleanliness, gender, etc. and better WASH services that enhance resilience against climate change.



Key problems identified by the project

- Lack of skills and employment opportunity
- Lack of WASH facilities, healthcare services, waste management system and climate resilient alternative livelihood options
- Lack of awareness regarding climate sensitive and vector borne diseases
- Lack of employment opportunities and skill sets for women
- Limited access to government facilities





Highlights on proposed adaptation/ mitigation solutions

- Develop 12 slum improvement plans using Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) tools
- Construction 18 common family latrines, and 15 tubewells with raised platforms
- Reconstruction of 60 existing tubewells and 90 latrines with raised platforms
- Support 18 families for making climate resilient houses
- Form Community Improvement Committees (CICs), Functional Operation & Maintenance (O&M) committee, and create O&M fund in 12 slums
- Formation of 80 beneficiary groups and facilitate a total of 960 sessions/meetings on socio-economic consequence of climate change
- Provide 80 (two-day long) Income Generating Activities (IGA) related skills development training, and small grant support to 2,000 beneficiaries


