Key problems identified by the project


- Increased health risks due to COVID-19
- Riverbank erosion and flood affect Sirajganj city almost every year with increasing intensities
- Inability to repair houses damaged during flood due to poor financial condition
- Lack of basic services, i.e., water, sanitation, education, health and social
- Lack of sustainable livelihoods is the core problem for climate migrants
- Lack of awareness reduces access to services from Pourashava and Government
- Lower employment opportunity due to lack of skills among climate migrants





Highlights on proposed adaptation/ mitigation solutions

- Distribution of COVID-19 hygiene materials among 5,000 households
- Delivering 170 hand washing devices in the community for awareness and to scale up better practices
- Installation of 9 hand washing stations in eight schools and one health centre
- Installation (33) and renovation (188) of tube wells at the community
- 268 existing unhygienic latrines will be converted into hygienic ones
- Installation of 46 single-pit latrines for extremely poor households
- Housing improvement support (plinth raising, pillar, roof, wall etc.) for 50 extremely poor and climate-vulnerable households
- Arranging skill development training for 100 youth to increase income
- Skill development training and cash transfer for 150 women for starting a business (rearing poultry, duck, cow, sewing etc.)
